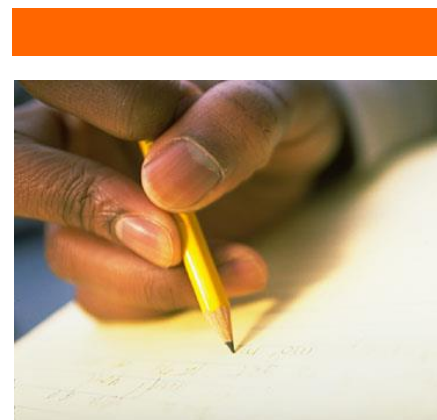
**NEW 2-PART
SCHEDULE!**

The Chicago Area Writing Project is sponsoring its 39th Invitational Summer Institute in Writing, called the Summer Institute Plus to reflect the 2-part schedule, for selected K-college teachers who want to improve their own writing and writing instruction as well as to learn to design and lead workshops for other teachers. Applicants must have at least three years of teaching experience.

Summer Institute participants will receive all handouts and two professional books at no charge. Participants will develop a shortened version of a workshop demonstration that could be included in a CAWP Professional Development program and immerse themselves in research and strategies related to writing instruction.

Please note: Due to funding and class size limitations, we cannot accept all applicants to our Summer Institute. To assure a place, apply for early acceptance. After each deadline, selected applicants will be invited to a 30-minute interview with CAWP Teacher Consultants on Mar. 23, 2019, May 18, 2019 or a mutually agreed upon date. SI participants will be chosen from these interviews.

Location/ Attendance: University of Illinois at Chicago campus. Attendance at all Summer Institute sessions, including Orientation Day on June 8, 2019, is required for acceptance into the program. Holding the Summer Institute is contingent upon enrollment of at least 10 teachers.
